WHY IT MATTERS

Amazonian plant medicines have reached people around the world. Far fewer know where the plants come from or what it takes to keep the forest and the knowledge alive.

THE WORK

Pacha Nishi, an Indigenous-led organization in Peru, combines Shipibo plant knowledge, regenerative agroforestry, and ecological research to restore degraded forest, support local livelihoods, and carry ancestral wisdom forward.
